This year's OutRight is focusing on air pollution and protecting children's right to health and a safe, clean environment.



## Chisenhale is a Rights Respecting School!

In previous years our school has achieved the Bronze and Silver awards from the United Nations. This year we are "Going for Gold".

The Rights Respecting Councillors for Chisenhale School were elected by their classmates in September and their job is to help Chisenhale School become a United Nations Rights Respecting School.



Last week we met Chief Joseph ole Tipanko from a Maasai village in Kenya. Chief Joseph told us how he was chosen to be a Maasai Chief when he was eighteen, and that he has travelled to England to raise funds to help build a well in his village. This will ensure that Maasai children have their right to clean water protected in the future.

## All About OutRight

"OutRight" is an annual campaign promoted by UNICEF. It aims to empower children and young people to realise their own rights, and to speak out in support of the rights of all children.

**Article 24: Every child has the right to the best possible health.**

One third of all children in the UK live in areas with the most harmful level of air pollution.
