## New family support surgery every month

Overland Children's Centre are running a monthly family support surgery in school, starting in January. The first session will be on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> January and then they will come in on the first Thursday of the month. For the first session we will run a coffee morning/info session and after that parents can make an appointment with the family support worker.

They can advise on behaviour, routines, welfare and benefits and support parents with getting back into employment. They can also help with referrals to speech therapy and other services for children who are not yet in school. They can also support families with older children with more general issues.

## Changes to the EYFS

The Early Years has had a make-over in the holidays! Chris has worked very hard taking down walls, putting in doors and building a beautiful perspex wall. Thanks to the PTA we have some new furniture and carpets too. It looks fabulous, and will look even better after the next break.

Last term was spent reviewing how we did things in the early years and considering how it could be improved. We visited other schools, took advice from the local authority and did lots of talking in the team. There were already changes from September as we no longer had a part-time Nursery class but we felt that the environment wasn't working as well as it could when we needed to do our focus teaching. The best way to do this was to make the 'home' classes separate: we now have one Nursery class with 36 children and two small Reception classes with 22/23 children. The staff have moved around a little, but everyone is still there. The children spend the majority of the day moving around the whole space, but the Reception classes can now close their doors and the Nursery still have free-flow in two large rooms and the playground when necessary. This reflects how the rest of the school is organised with children being taught English and maths in their year groups and in mixed classes for the rest of their curriculum subjects.
